"Evangelism" Center #1

Outreach - Coach: Tim Lueking

Outreach has three major objectives for 2008 as we strive to help fulfill the vision to "Reach, Teach, and Serve." First, we desire to expand our outreach team made up of people that are passionate about reaching the lost for Christ. Second, we desire to continue engaging the community with more creative and fun KIP projects that will bring people closer to Christ. Finally, we desire to get more people from the church involved in the outreach activities in areas of preparation, prayer support, and participation.

Angel Food Ministries - Coaches: Nancy Reed, Katherine Lueking

Are you looking for \$60 worth of groceries for \$30? Angel Food Ministries provides high-quality, low-cost food relief. Anyone (no qualifications are necessary!) may order a monthly food "unit" for \$30 and pick up the food at the church on the designated pick up date and time. A "unit" feeds a family of four for about a week, or a senior citizen for a month. Menu order forms will be available (via www.CiceroChristianChurch.org and the church) mid-month for order pick up the following month. Many volunteer opportunities are available – especially on pickup day.

Kindness in Progress - Coach: OPEN

After launching our Servant Evangelism "Kindness in Progress" (KIP) in late 2006, we're creating a team to take these simple acts of kindness to our community to a new level. Past events have included pumping gas, pumpkin give-away, trunk or treat, business blast, servefest, and serving at the state fair pork tent. If you have an interest in joining or coaching this very important team, see Pastor Tim.

Friendship Calling - Coaches: Sue Hahn, Susan Hoch

Our mission is to share God's love by welcoming each first time attender with a personal visit, a plate of cookies, and answers to questions about our church.

Prayer Ministry (Watchmen on the Wall) - Coach: Nancy Reed

Our purpose is to rebuild the wall of prayer and to bring prayer warriors to the front lines. We are seeking those who are willing to become a part of this ministry to help us develop aggressively in the coming year.

Prayer Chain (email) - Coach: Beth Roberts.

Requests and praises made known to us via phone calls, email or the bulletin insert will be sent out over our email prayer chain several times a week. To join the group, send a message with subject "subscribe" to prayer@CiceroChristianChurch.org.

Family Night (Wednesday) - Coach: Tim Lueking

Our Wednesday night service provides a meal for the entire family followed by Christian Education opportunities for all ages (infants, preschool, children, youth, adults), followed by worship choir practice. We have three sessions a year: fall (September –December), Winter (January – Spring Break) and Spring (after spring break). We often offer a summer course as well, but we rest in August. In 2007 we introduced *Financial Peace University* as one of our elective classes. We're exploring ways of expanding the opportunities in 2008, including a monthly informal family worship service.

Family Night Meals - Coach: Kay Messenger, assistant Shirley Rennaker

Our team continues to expand our palates as they prepare wonderful and diverse meals every Wednesday evenings during family night sessions for a small donation.

Home Fellowships (LIFE) – Coach: Ben Radant

Our mission is to create communities that are authentic and real, centered around Christ in a home environment. Goals for 2008 are to have 10 new Home Fellowships begin, equip leaders better to lead, and encourage quarterly service projects in the community of the home fellowships.

Team Ministry Administration - Coaches: Doug Wiggers, Beth Roberts

Over the last year we have seen some exciting news come out of our team ministries as they have sought to engage the church and community. One of the most exciting events that we witnessed was the addition of a new team ministry *Tomorrow's Future*. We hope to see much success for the Kingdom from the creation of new teams *Kindness in Progress*, *Angel Food Ministries*, *HomeTouch*, *Family Ministry* and *Recreation*.

In 2008, we desire to strengthen the team ministries by equipping each ministry with right tools; increased individual involvement in the team ministries; and cooperations - ministries working in conjunction with one another to fulfill this vision and engage the people in the church and community.

"Music & Worship" Center #2

Manager: Doug Wiggers

Music & Worship - Coach: Doug Wiggers

The vision of the Music Ministry is "To respond to all that God is with all that we have." This large team involves several areas.

Worship Team - A group of rhythm instrumentalists and vocalists who lead worship on a weekly basis. Vocalists are grouped together and scheduled on a rotating basis, participating in worship once every 4-6 weeks. Vocalists must be active in the Worship Choir. The Worship Team leads and accompanies most of our congregational music as well as offering periodic worship features and/or preludes. Musically included are drums, bass guitar, organ/synth, piano, 3-4 vocalists plus the Worship Leader, and an occasional acoustic/electric guitar. This group rehearses Thursday evenings.

Praise Band - An active part of our worship services primarily focused on accompanying the Worship Team in congregational music. Additionally, a feature piece is played on occasion. The Praise Band is comprised of mainly brass instruments (trumpet, trombones) and saxophones and participates in worship two times per month. Rehearsals are mainly held Sunday morning with the "as needed" extra rehearsals. Musicians with high school level musicianship and above are welcomed.

Worship Choir - Assists in leading worship once per month. Rehearsals occur on Wednesday evenings from 7:10–8:40pm. We seek to model an attitude of genuine worship to our congregation.

Orchestra - An ensemble of mix ages and ability levels who desire to use their instruments four to six times per year. This group occasionally accompanies the Worship Choir and is widely used during seasonal events such as Christmas, Easter, and Ministry-wide productions.

Woodwinds - Comprise flutes, clarinets, and oboes and will be used once per month for worship. Rehearsals are on Thursday nights along with the Worship Team.

Handbell Choir – A unique ensemble that plays in worship around once per month with rehearsals occurring on Saturday mornings. In order to be a part of this ensemble, you must be able to read music.

Projection – Technicians operate the software used to project images onto the screens for worship service, using Easy Worship software and working closely with the sound and video teams for smooth transitions.

Other Opportunities – Anyone can participate in Music Ministry opportunities (or "special music" during our Sunday worship services. Vocal solos are frequently used and instrumental soloists are invited to participate as well. Solid musical abilities and a heart for God are needed to participate in this ministry.

Adult Drama – Coach: OPEN

We desire to creatively worship God through drama. To impart the joy of the Lord, from which comes our strength and to powerfully and effectively present the gospel and to inspire and encourage believers. We're looking forward to our endeavor with a new interactive dinner theater presentation of *Uncle Phil's Diner*, and hope to incorporate more drama into our Sunday worship service. A leadership council is planning now for how we can reach, teach and serve the community in 2008 through drama.

Sound - Coach: Jeff Hendricks

The sound team supports all the audio needs for Sunday morning worship and special events. They work closely with the video team to capture the services for duplication and distribution. Duties include operating the sound and lighting boards, controlling the input and output equipment, setting up and maintaining the microphones and speakers used throughout the building, including the portable systems used throughout the church.

Special Events – Coach: Beth Roberts

Provide fellowship events (usually involving food and sometimes special entertainment) for the entire church community. Usually in conjunction with the office support staff, this ministry provides support for ministry-sponsored all-church events. Events include Thanksgiving Dinner, Easter Breakfast, traveling musical groups, and such.

Wedding - Coach: Shirley Whisman

Wedding coordination's goal to provide outstanding weddings for our church family and community. We work with our ministers and the engaged couple to provide appropriate pre-marital counseling and assistance in coordinating the big event.

Video - Coach: Rod Reed

The video team supports all the visual needs for Sunday morning worship and special events. They work closely with the audio and projection team to capture the services for duplication and distribution. Duties include operating the cameras, switchers, controlling the input and output equipment for video.

“LOFT 24/7 Youth” Center #3

Middle School (grades 6-8), **High School** (grades 9-12) and **College** - Coach: Chad Allen. Assistant Coaches: Mike House, Jay St. Peters, Jane Shields, Barb Green, Buck Green, Jason Razo, Koren Razo; Erin Fultz, Eric King

Our team exists to disciple teens through young adults (grades 6 and up) through Sunday School, teen worship services, special events, retreats, mission trips, community service, prayer, music, sports and small groups. We have a weekly service on Wednesday at 6:02pm and monthly Sunday morning worship services at 10:30am which will expand to two times monthly in 2008, and will have a mission trip opportunity over summer break.

Family Ministry - Coach: OPEN

The goal of this new team ministry is to strengthen the family unit as a whole. The church's aim should always be to help families succeed. Family ministry is a mind-set, not a program. Programs and friends come and go, but people share a special connection with their families forever. Our goal is to develop an environment that not only supports families, but also provides avenues for families to minister. We are seeking people interested in joining the leadership council for this new ministry to set the vision.

“Early Childhood & Elementary” Center #4

Our mission is to reach children on their level, connecting them with Christ and growing them in God's ways in a loving, caring, and safe environment. Accomplishments in 2007 include baby dedications, pager system expansion, and continually looking for volunteers to work in our growing ministry.

K.I.T. (Kids in Training; ages 4, 5 and Kindergarten) – Coach: Ben Radant
Kids in Training is provided to teach children ages 4, 5 and in Kindergarten to be disciples of Jesus based on Luke 18:16-17. Goals are to continue to make the KIT experience extremely effective and age appropriate and find people who view KIT as *their* ministry to the children. We're looking for people to build relationships and teach the children in the ways of the Lord, while providing safety.

Grades 1-5 - Coach: Ben Radant

The ministry to children in grades 1-5 has a goal based on Luke 18:16-17 to teach children how to be disciples of Jesus. One goal in '07 of stable and consistent volunteers for Sunday School and Kids Church Live Worship has had mixed success with new volunteers while still striving for consistency. We encourage parents to be involved and build relationships with the elementary children.

Our missions team is funded by you! 10% of all money received in the general offering, as well as funds designated toward missions, support several “living links” on a regular basis: *Dunamis Christian Ministries*(*White Mountain Apache Reservation in Arizona*), *Hope Family Care Center* (*Cicero*), *Mephibosheth Ministries* (*Cicero*), *Kulpahar Kids Home* (*India*), *Damou Christian Mission* (*Haiti*), *Mission Jamaica* (*Jamaica*), *Rainbow Christian Camp* (*Converse*). In addition to living links, missions receives many requests for support and prayerfully considers each request. Students studying in a field of Christian Education may also appeal to the Mission team for support of their studies. The missions team sets aside 10% of their funds to support community benevolence requests.

Meet with individuals and families requesting financial help. Once the form for a request is completed through the church office, our team members invite the individual or family to come to church on a Sunday morning, where we meet with them after services to discuss their individual circumstances. Our budget is funded by 10% of the missions budget.

The purpose of the church office staff is to provide service and support to the ministerial and team ministry staff and our congregation.

Property Management - Coach: Tom Ping

Tom and his custodial team and volunteers have the huge task of keeping our facility in running order. We have over 45,000 square feet under two roofs (that hopefully no longer leak after being repaired this fall!). The property team oversees changes to our facility as well, examples from 2007 include expansion of Discovery Cove, moving the Library, securing storage space offsite, and new air conditioning units in the kitchen and administrative office.

Our custodial team keeps very busy – with the expected tasks of emptying trash, vacuuming, and stocking supplies to painting, changing light bulbs on 40 foot ladders, scrubbing carpets, cleaning grease traps, waxing floors and much, much, more. During the school year the facility has more than 100 people on site everyday, and evenings activities continue to grow.

A yearly evaluation of Team Ministry is required and occurs in October. A listing of proposed team ministry Managers and Coaches committed to serve for the following year is provided for congregational affirmation. Terms begin January 1 and last one year for Coaches and Managers and three years for Elders.

Teams with no current leaders are listed as "OPEN." If you have an interest in serving in an area without a coach, or wish to launch a new team ministry, contact Beth Roberts.

Individuals listed as team ministry managers and coaches, in addition to the cabinet officers, comprise the governing body called Team Ministry Cabinet. A chair, co-chair, secretary and treasurer are selected each year for one year terms.
