2010 Preliminary Team Ministry Descriptions as of September 18, 2009

Team Coaches and Managers are to update these descriptions via the Forecast Form. Return to Team Ministry church office mailbox or email to beth@reachteachserve.org for correction and presentation to the congregation at the annual congregational meeting.

Individuals listed as Team Ministry Managers and Coaches, in addition to the cabinet officers, comprise the governing body of our church called the Team Ministry Cabinet. The Cabinet is divided into Team Ministry Centers, and each center is managed by a Ministry Staff member or an Elder. A Ministry Center is comprised of individual *Team Ministries*, each lead by a Team Ministry Coach, and a Team Ministry may have numerous team *Players*. The Team Ministry Cabinet, votes on key issues before the congregation, such as the budget or a new Senior Minister. Four officers serve the Cabinet: a Secretary and Treasurer are nominated each year by the Cabinet, and a Cabinet Chairman and Co-Chairman are selected by and from the Elders.

Qualifications for Elders and Team Ministry Coaches and Managers are found in the Operations Handbook, a part of the Bylaws for Cicero Christian Church. You may obtain a copy from the church office, or you may view or print from www.CiceroChristianChurch.org.

A yearly evaluation of Team Ministry is required for approval the third Sunday in October. A listing of proposed team ministry Managers and Coaches committed to serve for the following year is provided for congregational affirmation. Terms begin January first and last one year for Coaches and Managers and three years for Elders. Prior to this meeting, the candidates for Team Ministry Coach and Manager as well as Elder are provided for the congregation to review with instructions to resolve any conflict with a candidate. Absence of any objection of a candidate, or the resolution of an objection, is considered the congregation's affirmation of the candidate.

Teams with no current leaders are listed as "OPEN." Coaches notated as pending are new since the last evaluation, and in midst of the approval process. If you have an interest in serving in an area without a coach, or wish to launch a new team ministry, contact Beth Roberts, team ministry coordinator.

Two Elder terms ends December 31, 2009: John Knapp, David McGill. At the time of this printing, the desire of these men concerning seeking reaffirmation has not been confirmed.

“Evangelism” Center #1

Outreach - Coach: Tim Lueking

Outreach strives to help fulfill the vision to “Reach, Teach, and Serve.” First, we desire to expand our outreach team made up of people that are passionate about reaching the lost for Christ. Second, we desire to continue engaging the community with more creative and fun Kindness in Progress Servant Evangelism (KIP) projects that will bring people closer to Christ. Finally, we desire to get more people from the church involved in the outreach activities in areas of preparation, prayer support, and participation.

Angel Food Ministries - Coaches: Katherine Lueking, Jean Medonic (pending)

Are you looking for \$60 worth of groceries for \$30? Angel Food Ministries provides high-quality, low-cost food relief. Anyone (no qualifications are necessary) may order a monthly food “unit” for \$30 and pick up the food at the church on the monthly designated pick up date and time. A “unit” feeds a family of four for about a week, or a senior citizen for a month. Senior units, consisting of 10 heat and eat individual meals, allergen free units, and several specials (such as a box of chicken breasts) are available monthly. Menu order forms are available (via www.CiceroChristianChurch.org and the church) mid-month for order pick up the following month. Many volunteer opportunities are available – especially on pickup day.

Kindness in Progress - Coach: OPEN

After launching our Servant Evangelism “Kindness in Progress” (KIP) in late 2006, we’ve completed two dozen events open to our church community for participation, as well as numerous individual efforts to perform a simple act of kindness to show God’s love. However, in 2009 we faltered with our focus on these efforts for the lack of a team leader! We are looking for a person to come on board to lead this team and expand our outreach efforts as team coach. If you have an interest in joining or coaching this very important team, see Pastor Tim.

Friendship Calling - Coaches: Sue Hahn, Susan Hoch

Our team functions to greet visitors with a warm welcome and a visit to their home with edible goodies. We offer to answer questions they have about church and its beliefs and programs.

Prayer Ministry - Coach: OPEN

We are seeking a prayer warrior to take our prayer ministry to the next level. Our goal is to cover the church — ministers, ministries, and members — with prayer and prayer opportunities. We have a House of Prayer that is available 24-hours to our community. If you would like access, please stop by the office and pick up a free keycard.

Prayer Chain (email) - Coach: Beth Roberts.

Requests and praises (and occasionally all-church announcements and reminders) made known to us via phone calls, email, or the bulletin are sent out over our email prayer chain several times a week. The content of the prayer requests is printed out every Friday for pickup on Sunday by those who do not have access to email.

Family Night (Wednesday) - Coach: Tim Lueking

Our Wednesday night service provides a meal for the entire family followed by Christian Education opportunities for all ages (infants, preschool, children, youth, adults), followed by worship choir practice. We have three sessions a year: Fall (September –December), Winter (January – Spring Break) and Spring (after spring break). We often offer a summer course.

Family Night Meals - Coach: Kay Messenger, assistant Shirley Rennaker

Our team continues to expand our palates as they prepare wonderful and diverse meals every Wednesday evenings for a small donation. This dedicated team is also key to the feast provided with many of the all-church meals. Opportunities to assist with this team include shopping, food preparation, cleanup and washing dishes!

Home Fellowships – Coach: Ben Radant

Our mission is to create communities that are authentic and real, centered around Christ in a home environment. Reach – People who want to be connected to CCC and lead others to Christ; Teach – Biblical worldviews and hold each other accountable; Serve – each other and the community around us. Over a dozen home fellowships are operating on a regular basis. If you have interest in launching or joining a home group, contact pastor Ben.

“Music & Worship” Center #2

Music & Worship - Coach: Doug Wiggers

The vision of the Music Ministry is “To respond to all that God is with all that we have.” This large team involves several areas.

Worship Team - A group of rhythm instrumentalists and vocalists who lead worship on a weekly basis. Vocalists are grouped together and scheduled on a rotating basis, participating in worship once every 4-6 weeks. The Worship Team leads and accompanies most of our congregational music as well as offering periodic worship features and/or preludes. Musically included are drums, bass guitar, organ/synth, piano, 3-4 vocalists plus the Worship Leader, and an occasional acoustic/electric guitar. This group rehearses on varying weeknights.

Praise Band - An active part of our worship services primarily focused on accompanying the Worship Team in congregational music. The Praise Band is comprised of mainly brass instruments (trumpet, trombones) and saxophones and participates in worship two times per month. Rehearsals are held during the week. Musicians with high school level musicianship and above are welcomed.

Worship Choir - Assists in leading worship once per month. Rehearsals occur during a weekday evening prior to the Sunday of leadership. We seek to model an attitude of genuine worship to our congregation.

Orchestra - An ensemble of mixed ages and ability levels who desire to use their instruments once per month. This group occasionally accompanies the Worship Choir and is widely used during seasonal events such as Christmas, Easter, and Ministry-wide productions.

Handbell Choir – This unique ensemble plays in worship around once per month with rehearsals occurring on Saturday mornings. In order to be a part of this ensemble, you must be able to read music.

Projection – Technicians operate the software used to project images onto the screens for worship service, using Easy Worship software and working closely with the sound and video teams for smooth transitions.

Communion – Our church observes the Lord’s Supper every Sunday, and we seek volunteers to come in to the church during the week and prepare the juice and the bread for Sunday service. We also offer communion to our homebound as requested.

Other Opportunities – Anyone can participate in Music Ministry opportunities (or “special music”) during our Sunday worship services. Vocal solos are frequently used and instrumental soloists are invited to participate as well. Solid musical abilities and a heart for God are needed to participate.

Adult Drama – Coach: Doug Wiggers

Leadership Council: Alicia King, Matt Russell, Jill Francisco, Jessica Hendricks, Sharon Bailey

We desire to creatively worship God through drama, including seasonal productions and sketches for worship services, to impart the joy of the Lord, from which comes our strength and to powerfully and effectively present the gospel and to inspire and encourage believers. Historically we have prepared and presented Broadway-style musicals, Cantatas with full Orchestra, and Comical Dinner Theater.

Sound - Coach: Jeff Hendricks

The sound team supports all the audio needs for Sunday morning worship and special events. They work closely with the video team to capture the services for duplication and distribution. Duties include operating the sound and lighting boards, controlling the input and output equipment, setting up and maintaining the microphones and speakers used throughout the building, including the portable systems used throughout the church.

Special Events – Coach: Beth Roberts

Provide fellowship events (usually involving food and sometimes special entertainment) for the entire church community. Usually in conjunction with the office support staff, this ministry provides support for ministry-sponsored all-church events.

Wedding - Coach: Lisa Wiggers

Each wedding coordination’s goal is to invest time with each couple in coordinating all the details to create their “dream” day with God’s blessing.

Video - Coach: Rod Reed

The video team supports all the visual needs for Sunday morning worship and special events, weddings, and other church activities. They work closely with the audio and projection team to capture the services for duplication and distribution. Duties include operating the cameras, switchers, controlling the input and output equipment for video.

“LOFT 24/7 Youth” Center #3

Reach Teens – Teach Christ – Serve Relentlessly. Our team exists to disciple teens through young adults (grades 6 and up) through Sunday School, teen worship services, special events, retreats, mission trips, community service, prayer, music, sports and small groups. We have a regular devotional and fellowship service on Wednesdays and a bi-monthly VERTICAL Sunday worship services at 10:30am.

“Early Childhood & Elementary” Center #4

Our mission is to REACH out to the small children, TEACH them about God, Jesus and the Bible, and SERVE as volunteers to attain this goal. We are continually looking for volunteers to work in our growing ministry.

K.I.T. (Kids in Training; ages 4, 5 and Kindergarten) – Coach: Ben Radant

Kids in Training is provided to teach children ages 4, 5 and in Kindergarten to be disciples of Jesus based on Luke 18:16-17. Goals are to continue to make the KIT experience extremely effective and age appropriate and find people who view KIT as *their* ministry to the children. We’re looking for people to build relationships and teach the children in the ways of the Lord, while providing safety.

Grades 1-5 - Coach: Ben Radant

The ministry to children in grades 1-5 has a goal based on Luke 18:16-17 to teach children how to be disciples of Jesus. We encourage parents to be involved and build relationships with the elementary children.

Men’s Ministry (ATOMIC) Coach: Jeff Pieper.

Our men’s ministry uses ATOMIC (**A**ccountability **T**o **O**ther **M**en **I**n **C**hrist) as their motto, and strives to be the hands and feet of God, and continue developing relationships with other men who wish to grow in a more Godly and Biblical manner as to glorify our Savior. This ministry focuses on providing discipleship opportunities for men within our church and community.

Men’s Breakfast - Coach: Chad Hartwick

A filling hot breakfast is served each Friday morning at 6am (except for August). All men (high school and up) are invited for an hour of fellowship, prayer and study just with other men as a springboard into accountability. Several lesson series are covered every year with rotating teachers, with an open discussion forum.

Tomorrow’s Future - Coach: Lori Seaman

Our mission is to reach each family who has a newborn in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) at St. Vincent’s Hospital on 86th Street; to teach each patient and family that God is with them through difficult times and loves us greatly; to serve each patient, family and staff with acts of kindness and gifts of love. Goals include providing goodie baskets, small gifts and candy at Easter, cards, gifts to parents on mother’s/ father’s day, provide books to each unit.

“Dove Tail” Center #6

Crosslight Christian School – Christian Education is segmented into three areas overseen by the Crosslight Christian School Board as a ministry team of Cicero Christian Church. All three segments operate within the church facility. *School Board:* Lacy McGrew, president; Mike Jenkins, Steven Hancock, Jim Craig, Renee Kinder, Wendi Russell

Montessori Preschool - Coach: Abbey Brooks; Director: Jodie Bolinger

Our main goal is to educate the children about God and give them the skills they need to enter Kindergarten. We want to give them the God-centered skill sets they need to enter public school. The preschool was named “Kids

of the Kingdom” from it’s creation in the early 90s, the name was changed to “Crosslight Christian” and the Montessori method of teaching was implemented in the fall of 2004. Classes are offered for children ages three through five in morning or afternoon sessions during the school year.

Children rotate through rooms assigned to targeted specialties, including practical life, science and math, and are lovingly taught by a team lead by director Jodie Bolinger, including teachers Ernestine Smith, Abbey Brooks, Amy Ashley, Danor Orr and assistant Mary Lynn Carson.

Montessori Kindergarten – Coach & Director: Beth Rutan

Our school provides a Christian Montessori education for kindergarten and pre-first grade children using the Montessori method of teaching and Christian curriculum from A Beka. Our kindergarten is in our fifth year with a class of 9 students, and we continue to serve the community with God’s blessings. Beth Rutan is the executive director over the kindergarten and preschool and director and kindergarten teacher. We are seeking dedicated volunteers to come in and read regularly with our children.

Daycare – Coach & Director: Joanna Moore

CCD is a safe and secure daycare ministry (Monday-Friday 6a-6p) where children ages 6 weeks to 12 years will receive excellent care and participate in Bible-based activities. We strive to care for the whole family in our church and community. We added two new programs in 2009: the state food program was implemented, and we have been approved as a facility that will accept CCDF Vouchers (a program for low income families). Crosslight Christian Daycare was established as Jesus and Me Child Care in 1998.

Christian books, devotionals, DVDs, VHS tapes, fiction, non-fiction, and Bible study series are available for checkout in room 112, on the east side of the family life center wing. We accept donations of Christian books, videos, DVDs and reference materials through the office or in the basket in the library (mark “donation for library” please). Donated materials are checked for content and condition and prepared for circulation. Everyone can use our library!

The birthday card ministry places our congregation into age/gender groups and then our team members send birthday cards to honor the recipients on their special day on behalf of Cicero Christian Church. We also send congratulations to families with new babies. This team needs to know your birthday to be effective, so providing your birthdate to the office to be included. We can always use birthday cards – bring donations to the office.

This team maintains the flower beds, plants flowers and orders plaques as needed for the memorial garden (located on the south side of the church) and gazebo located on the south side of the church. You may request a plaque in memory of a loved one.

The goal of the web team is to continue to improve our chief electronic communication tool, www.CiceroChristianChurch.org and www.ReachTeachServe.org. We want your first stop for information to be our church website. Our site includes an online event calendar; sermon audio files, bulletins and notes; ministry blogs; event pictures; church history; financial history, and access to many forms. In 2009 we introduced searching of our site. Our goal is to continue to keep the information current, and to transition to the reach teach serve design as the primary site. We are exploring how to best implement sermon video on our site. The computer team supports the computer and networking needs of our staff and on-site ministries. We currently have a network with nearly 25 computers, and in 2009 upgraded our file server and are working toward creating a file server for the AV and worship ministry.

Our mission is to help those who can't afford professional movers to transport their belongings from one local home to another in a timely manner. We like to have several weeks notice of a request for assistance, and then we like to be organized on move day. Request for moves may be made through the church office at least three weeks in advance. We need lots of manpower!

HomeTouch strives to meet the challenge of staying in touch with members who have been unable to attend worship and/or participate in church programs and activities because of being homebound, attending college or serving in the military. A bulletin, prayer requests and activities page is included with each weekly mailing. If you would like to assist in this ministry, especially in making home personal contact, or if you know of someone who permanently or temporarily needs this service, contact Marcia House or the church office.

Men of our congregation serve communion and collect offering during worship services, and aide attenders in finding seats at services. We need additional men to assist in this service on a rotating schedule. See Kenny or Walter Morris to be added to the schedule.

Blood pressure checks are offered the last Sunday monthly, and we need help from those who can take a blood pressure, and those who can help with the charts. Hope Family Care Center is located at 270 West Jackson to serve the underserved and underinsured of Hamilton County through free health clinics 3-4 times monthly (www.hopefamilycare.org).

Community Garden – Coach: OPEN (proposed new team and center)
The Reach, Teach, Serve Community Garden was launched in the spring of 2009 with the goal to provide free produce to our church family and local community – something for nothing. A loop of irrigation with a pump system was installed to pull free water from our. Volunteers were sought to adopt a plant and help maintain 2000 square feet of strip gardens. A half-acre of sweet corn was planted and disappeared quickly. Future plans include planting fruit trees, improving the soil, increasing size, planning the sections for spring, starting seeds from scratch in partnership with Mephibosheth and their on-site greenhouse, seeking grants and donated supplies, soliciting volunteers, then planting and maintaining a robust garden in 2010. A garden-savvy team leader and team players willing to get dirty are needed for this big project.

Mugs & Hugs Coffee Cafe - Coaches Shirley Bales, Beth Rutan

Did you know you can get a light breakfast at church on Sunday morning? Pastries, coffee and juice are available at the northern family life center entrance for a free-will donation, but for those who choose not to or cannot donate, we welcome the chance to serve them. Panera Bread provides pastries, bread and bagels which we deliver to Wheeler Mission each and every week as part of this team ministry. Opportunities to serve include at the counter each Sunday morning as well as picking up supplies and delivering bread to the mission. We are able to donate the majority of our proceeds to other ministries or missions.

This ministry provides food to needy people through a free in-house food pantry. Your donations of money and food support this much-used pantry. Open weekdays through the office for Hamilton County residents, we request recipients limit their visits to at least 2 weeks apart. We'll serve about 200 families and 750 individuals, spending about \$4,000 in 2009 all from your gifts, and we must restock about every six weeks. A list of stocked items is online.

With more than a dozen acres that needs to be maintained, as well as numerous flower beds, a large parking lot, and trees and bushes, this task can be overwhelming. But we've got many dedicated people who donate their time and equipment to keep the yard mowed, and many servants who keep our flowerbeds in great condition. We're always interested in people looking to join the mowing rotation, or for people with green thumbs who don't mind getting their hands dirty.

In addition to the 16 acres triangle on which the church is built, we own 72 tillable acres to our south and reaching to highway 19, which are currently under contract with a local farmer. Continue to pray for God to make his vision clear for this property!

Goals accomplished in 2009 included mowing for the entire season with volunteer help, maintaining flower beds, controlling weeds and geese adequately, and making sure the grounds are cleared of snow as cost-effectively as possible. Goals of the missions team are: 1) Develop and inspire local Timothy's then support them in the mission field; 2) Identify qualified benevolence needs for assistance and education; 3) Respond to outside requests for spiritual and financial help; 4) Maintain an awareness program through various media outreaches; 5) Send groups and teams to assist in the mission field.

Our missions team is funded by you! Until May of 2008, 10% of all money received in the general offering was designated for use by the missions team, and since that time it the designation has increased to 11%. In addition, funds are often designated through offerings toward specific or general missions.

Our church supports several “living links” on a regular basis: *Dunamis Christian Ministries (White Mountain Apache Reservation in Arizona)*, *Hope Family Care Center (Cicero)*, *Mephibosheth Ministries (Cicero)*, *Kulpahar Kids Home (India)*, *Damou Christian Mission (Haiti)*, *Mission Jamaica (Jamaica)*, *Rainbow Christian Camp (Converse)*.

Our missions team receives many requests for support and prayerfully considers each request. Students studying in a field of Christian Education may also appeal to the Mission team for support of their studies. The missions team sets aside 10% of their funds to support community benevolence requests.

Benevolence - Coaches: Rick Hahn, Bev McGill, Mike Hutson

Meet with individuals and families requesting financial help both from outside our church family and inside the church family. Once the form for a request is completed through the church office, our team members invite the individual or family to come to church on a Sunday morning, where we meet with them after services to discuss their individual circumstances. Our goal is to plant a seed in their hearts by hearing a sermon and experiencing worship. Our budget is funded by 10% the missions budget. For our church members, we are available to assist in coaching in areas to improve your overall spiritual and financial picture. An Economic Recovery Team is being developed, led by Mike Hutson, to provide financial and life skill support and training to those members of our congregation in need.

The purpose of the church office staff is to provide service and support to the ministerial and team ministry staff and our congregation.

We moved to our present facility in September 1998. Our custodial team and volunteers have the huge task of keeping our facility—45,000 square feet under two roofs—in running order and oversees changes and upgrades to our facility. As the building ages, we anticipate increased routine maintenance and replacement of equipment as it ages and fails.

During the school year the facility has more than 100 people on site everyday, in addition to our primary function serving our congregation on a Sunday morning. Our custodial team keeps very busy – with the recurring tasks of emptying trash, vacuuming, setups, mopping, waxing, cleaning carpets, and stocking supplies, to special projects like painting, changing light bulbs on 40 foot ladders, cleaning grease traps, remodeling projects and much more.

Our finance team is striving to use Biblical stewardship principals (taught through Crown Ministry and Financial Peace University) to make wise choices concerning the gifts and offerings which keep this building open and the ministries operating. We have a great facility, and with that facility came a large mortgage. Our first goal is to avoid further debt and spend less than we are gifted. God blessed us in 2009 with the ability to keep within those guidelines. We use a purchase order system and follow a budget for expenditures, and are continually looking for ways to be better stewards Our financial reports, including weekly offerings, the current budget and budget spending reports, can be found on our website. Our second goal is to pay off our debt, which severely limits our ability to fund our ministry efforts. Our debt is in the form of a substantial mortgage, and 2009 was a particularly difficult year with volatile interest rates negatively affecting our complicated mortgage and eating up funds that could be used for ministry. We look forward to the spring of 2011, when we will be able to explore more stable funding options without cost-prohibitive penalties.
